



by the Atlantic Ocean, the rambling hills and mountains and the lovely lakes provide a wonderfully interesting location for the leisurely visitor.



Donegal

Wild and remote Malin Head on the Inishowen Peninsula in Donegal marks the most northerly point of the entire island of Ireland.

It sets the tone for the spirit of the county — independent, untamed and exciting, three quarters of its border formed by the Atlantic Ocean. Visitors can experience this for themselves walking the towering cliffs of **Sliabh Liag (Slieve League)** with the wonderfully named **One Man's Pass** at the summit.

Spectacular **Glenveagh National Park & Castle** is a true national treasure. The extensive 16,000 hectare park consists of mountain, rare raised bog land, lakes and woodland. It contains the largest herd of red deer in the country and the majestic Golden Eagle was reintroduced to Ireland in Glenveagh in 2001.

Donegal town itself is dominated by the 17th century **Donegal Castle**. Hand-woven **Donegal Tweed** is a unique cloth woven by hand on traditional wooden looms. Today, **Magee's Hand Weaving** in Donegal town is the largest stockist of Donegal Tweed in the world.

Donegal is a stronghold of the Irish language and has many **Gaeltacht** areas. Tradition and culture are still very strong here; music or dance sessions are common in pubs all over the county.

Golden beaches adorn the coastline, from some high points, six or seven beautiful strands can be seen stretching out along the shore. Near **Gweedore** the quartzite conical peak of **Errigal**,

Donegal's highest mountain, stands proudly, a challenge for the hill walker and like much of this dramatic county a tempting subject for the photographer.



Donegal towns and villages

Ardara E2 is one of Donegal's unique heritage towns. The establishment of cottage industries for the making of fine wool fabrics, tweeds and hand-knits for world distribution was an important element in the town's growth and the history of the town. Ardara is famous for its annual festivals which include "The Ardara Walking Festival" and "Cup of Tae Festival".

Ballyliffin C5 is a delightful village, with a fine long golden sandy beach at Pollan that stretches to over two miles in length. Ballyliffin is home to the Ballyliffin Golf Club, Ireland's most northerly club, and a gem of a destination for the visiting golfer.

Ballybofey E4 a twin town separated from Stranorlar by a beautiful stone bridge spanning the River Finn. There are pleasant walks along the river and also at nearby Drumboe Woods. The area is a haven for the visiting angler, as the River Finn is rich in freshwater fish.

Ballyshannon F3 is the oldest town in Ireland. The town's rich heritage is interpreted in its Historic Town Trail. It is the birthplace of Allingham the Poet and Rory Gallagher the rock guitarist. The internationally renowned Ballyshannon Folk Festival held towards the end of July and the Rory Gallagher festival in June are two of the town's major events.

Buncrana C5 principle town and resort on the lovely Inishowen Peninsula boasts a 5km sandy beach. Swan Park and the Buncrana coastal walk is a haven of peace for the leisure walker. Buncrana Golf Club, the oldest 9 hole links course in Ireland and the nearby North West Links offer a warm welcome for visiting golfers. The Lough Swilly Car Ferry operates from here to Rathmullan on the Fanad Peninsula during the high season.

Bundoran F3 has evolved into Ireland's premier seaside resort with a host of modern facilities for visitors and yet still remains true to its roots with its own special brand of hospitality and warmth. As a Failte Ireland Family Friendly designated area, families are guaranteed a special focus on their needs.

Donegal Town E3 is an attractive market town and seat of the O'Donnell's up until the 17th Century. The remains of the O'Donnell Clan stronghold "Donegal Castle" has been restored and is now a very popular visitor attraction. The town is also the home of Donegal tweed industry in Ireland and the Magee family.

Dunfanaghy C4 is situated on the shores of the shallow sandy inlet of Sheephaven Bay. Located on the outskirts of the village is the Workhouse which has an eco-exhibition exploring the dramatic story of the formation of the sand dunes and New Lake.

Dungloe D3 known locally as the Capital of the Rosses and plays host to the famous international Mary of Dungloe festival in July.

Downings C4 a traditional seaside resort with a fine curved beach looks out on Sheephaven Bay. A base for all types of water based activity including diving and windsurfing. Downings is renowned as one of the main sea angling centres in Donegal.

Killybegs E2 Ireland's premier commercial fishing port is a bustling town where local and foreign ships tower over the quayside. Take a stroll along the six heritage walks or drop in to see the simulator at the Killybegs Maritime & Heritage Centre.

Letterkenny D4 a vibrant town; particularly at night with the North West's largest number of popular pubs and clubs. An Grianan Theatre and the Regional Cultural Centre delight audiences throughout the year with their cultural programmes.

Malin Head B5 is not just Ireland's most northerly point, but an area of great scenic beauty and of historical, scientific and ecological importance.

Lifford E5 is the administrative capital of the county. The Seat of Power Visitor Centre with its historic mid 16th century Courthouse has been converted into an award winning heritage centre and restaurant. The North West's only greyhound track is also here. Cavanacor Historic House lies a few km from the town; it is the ancestral home of James Knox Polk, president of the U.S.A in the last century.

Ramelton D4 a Georgian historic town which sits at the mouth of the Lennon River where it enters Lough Swilly.

Rathmullan C5 a bustling seaside village with a long sandy beach on the shores of Lough Swilly and popular location for deep sea angling and coastal cruising. The Lough Swilly Car Ferry to Buncrana on the Inishowen Peninsula operates from here in the high season.

Glenveagh National Park lies in the heart

of the Derryveagh Mountains in the North West of Co. Donegal. It is a remote and hauntingly beautiful wilderness of rugged mountains and pristine lakes. The wild setting around Lough Veagh hosts the largest herd of red deer in Europe and since 2001 is home to Ireland's only Golden Eagles. The castle is surrounded by extensive, ornate and renowned gardens, with a rich variety of trees, shrubs and flowers from around the world. There is a beautifully located tearoom in the castle courtyard open all year round, where one can enjoy delicious home baking freshly made in the castle kitchen.

Malin Head, Ireland's most northerly point known locally as Banba's Crown is an area of great scenic beauty and of historical, scientific and ecological importance. The circuit of the Head will

take you past the Radio Station, built in 1910, and round the coast to Banba's Crown. the northern tip of Ireland.

Here a tall derelict building known locally as "The Tower" was built in 1908 by the Admiralty, and later used as a Lloyds Signal Station. During the Second World War, the small huts were built and used by our defence forces to keep a lookout and protect our neutrality. It is also a perfect starting point for a ramble along the cliffs to Hell's Hole, a remarkable subterranean cavern 250 feet long and 8 feet wide, into which the tide rushes with great force. Nearby is a picturesque natural arch called the Devil's Bridge.



Sliabh Liag (Slieve League) E2

Discover the many delights of Sliabh Liag, Teelin and Donegal's iconic attraction as you walk through the countryside on the verge of the mighty Atlantic Ocean. Rare flora, fauna and wildlife inhabit this precious and untouched landscape. And the very names of local pathways such as 'One Man's Pass' and 'The Pilgrim Path' evoke special memories and images. The scenery is stunning. The Sliabh Liag cliffs themselves are the highest marine cliffs in Europe, with the sheer cliff face stretching straight down to the wild Atlantic waves below. From this vantage point, the sightseer can get a dramatic view of imposing mountains, picturesque bays and romantic islands nearby.

Islands and the Gaeltacht (Irish Speaking) areas of Donegal

Looking out over the Atlantic Ocean, tasting the salt on your tongue and the sea breeze brushing your face, there is nothing similar to a visit to the Islands of Donegal to reinvigorate you. This is predominately where the Irish language and culture is still vibrant.

Wild and beautiful the islands have captured the imagination for thousands of years and provided stimulus for artists and writers. The perception that the islands of Donegal were remote has altered dramatically in recent years. Now they are easily accessible by boat. Plan your visit to the islands, some are very busy in high season (July and August especially). Very few of the islands have ATM banking facilities.

Please leave the islands as you find them. Respect the environment and dispose of litter in bins or take it away with you. When visiting the islands take care; a visit to the islands is a unique occurrence but remain vigilant as they are exposed to the elements. The island terrain is mainly rugged and the Atlantic Ocean can sometimes be wild.

Árainn Mór - Arranmore Island D2

Probably the most accessible of all the Gaeltacht islands, Árainn Mór has a resident population of approximately 600. From the island's rolling hills, observe views of the Rosses region (Na Rosa), the islands and the Donegal Mountains as a backdrop or visit two of the islands lovely beaches, at Aphort or Leabh Gharbh. A place to get away from it all and yet mainland Donegal is just a 15 minute boat journey.

Gabhla - Gola Island C3

The island, uninhabited since the 1960's, is approximately one mile from the mainland at Gaoth Dobhair (Gweedore). Evidence of past life remains in the form of stone houses, the homes of families, who have long since moved to the mainland. A number of houses have been restored by former residents and their families. The launching of a regular ferry service and the growing interest in ecology and cliff climbing is bringing back new life. Gabhla can be explored in a few hours over easy walking terrain. It is difficult to comprehend that you are just two miles removed from mainland Donegal.

Inis Bó Finne - Inishbofin Island C3

Located two miles from Machaire Rabhartaigh (Magheroarty) on the North West coast and has been relatively untouched and unspoilt. A rocky coast with cliffs, sea arches, caves and sandy beaches can be explored. Inland fields are home to the global endangered Corncrake and many other bird species. Barnacle Geese fly in to winter here. It is renowned for its water sports with surfing, kayaking and rock fishing growing in reputation annually.

Festivals: Boat Festival (July).

Getting there: Ferries sail seasonally from Magheroarty.



Toraigh - Tory Island C3

Standing staunchly against the storms of the Atlantic Ocean, Tory has been inhabited for 4,000 years. The resilient and independent residents of this Gaeltacht Island have their own music, songs, stories and dances and are expressions of a distinctive Irish Culture and tradition, preserved by remoteness. Historical sites include a round tower, a ruined church, the Tau Cross (one of only two found in Ireland). Tory has a unique wildlife and is internationally important for its birdlife particularly the globally threatened Corncrake and has nationally important colonies of cliff-nesting seabirds. Visitors can enjoy diving, fishing, rock climbing, whale or dolphin watching or walk a portion of the Donegal Way with beautiful scenery as a backdrop.

A signposted 4km looped walk starting at the Pier will take you along sandy tracks and minor roadways. This easy walk with exceptional scenery will take your breath away. When in Tory, why not partake or enjoy in the local scene, whether it be a céili (Irish dance) or an impromptu traditional Irish music session. Tory is also famous for its school of artists, who were encouraged by the late English painter Derek Hill, whose work has been exhibited all over the world.

Festivals: Féile Soilse Thoraí (July) celebrating Tory's musical and cultural traditions.

Inis Fraoich D2

Inishfree Island, approximately one square mile of sandy beaches and beautiful scenery, the island was home to thirty six families in a tightly-knit, caring community. Subsequently deserted, the island has been re-inhabited recently and Inis Fraoich's new residents are eager to help visitors benefit from the spiritual atmosphere that seems to pervade this unique place. Cultural courses are organised on the island at specific times and cover topics such as music, dancing, arts, crafts, poetry, nature and heritage.


The Gaeltacht

The Gaeltacht is the area in Donegal where the Irish Language is spoken and where the traditions of Irish song, dance and folklore prevail.

Cill Chartha (Kilcar), Gleann Colm Cille, and Ard a' Ratha (Ardara) are home to craft workshops producing hand-woven Donegal Tweed. Moving north along the craggy coastline, and somewhat inland, one comes to Donegal's Gaeltacht Lár (central Gaeltacht), located between Gweebara Bay, Gleann Fhinne, and Glendowen. Head north and you enter the Rosses, Gaoth Dobhair and Cloich Cheann Fhaola, areas of haunting natural beauty. The most northerly point of the Donegal Gaeltacht is located via the Rosguill Peninsula with journey's end at Fanad Head. The heart of the Donegal Gaeltacht can be found near the mystic mountains of the Derryveagh range and the scenic Poisoned Glen.



Leitrim towns and villages

Ballinamore H4 It is a thriving rural centre for the surrounding parishes and is internationally renowned for its abundance of coarse angling waters with a total of 40 lakes in a 10km radius.

The town offers many activities including walking, horse-riding, golfing and boating. It boasts lively evening entertainment with some great pubs and good restaurants.

Carrick-on-Shannon 13 built on the River Shannon; this is both the county town of Leitrim and the cruising capital of the Shannon. Carrick, as it is known locally is a thriving centre. It boasts a beautiful modern marina. It is widely acknowledged as an anglers paradise, the town itself is steeped in history, in particular the Costello chapel which is believed to be the smallest chapel in Europe.

Dowra G3 is the first village on the River Shannon, which rises from the Cuilcagh Mountains just 6 miles from Dowra at the Shannon Pot. Dowra village is on the borders of Cavan and Leitrim where the province of Ulster meets the province of Connacht.

Dromahair G3 is a picturesque village located on the banks of the river Bonet at its entry point to Lough Gill. It has an interesting history and a walk around the village will bring you into contact with remnants of its historic past.

Dromod ¹⁴ built along the River Shannon, this is a Tidy Towns winner with a lovely harbour area which is very popular with cruiser traffic. The Bog Oak water feature in the centre of the village is entitled "The Weeping Tree" and was made by a local craftsman from a piece of bog oak which was found nearby.

Drumshanbo H4 this pretty village is beautifully situated in the shadow of Sliabh-an-larainn towering to the north and the Arigna Mountains in the west. It is a renowned angling resort.

The town is famous for its musical tradition. A feature of the town is its unique High Street fronted by a stone wall, with stone steps leading up to Ireland's shortest Main Street.

Fenagh H4 At Fenagh two church ruins stand on the site of an earlier monastery, founded by St. Caillin in the 6th century. There are a number of prehistoric remains located in or near the village. Nineteen Gaelic Kings are said to be buried in the graveyard.

Jamestown 13 This is one of the most historic spots in County Leitrim and was named after King James I of England. One of the gates of the former fortified town is still standing. Today, Jamestown is a pleasant mooring spot and is also popular with anglers due to the good fishing and excellent hospitality.

Kiltyclogher G3 in the centre of the village is a Memorial to Sean MacDiarmada, one of the leaders of the 1916 Rising. The Michael Shanley Traditional weekend takes place in mid-August and during this time there are sessions, concerts and classes as well as a door-dancing competition.

Manorhamilton G3 village is the friendly, peaceful and picturesque capital of North Leitrim, situated in the centre of the North Leitrim Glens region which is famous for its hill-walking.

Rossinver G3 situated at the Southern shore of Lough Melvin is an excellent centre for game fishing. There is a fishery at Eden Quay and boats and gillies are available locally. There are some spectacular walks in the area.

It is sixteen feet long, 12 feet wide and 30 feet high. Each side of the aisle holds a coffin lined with lead and covered with slabs of thick reinforced glass.

Sligo


Sligo stands out from neighbouring counties with a greener and more luxuriant appearance punctuated with distinctive limestone mountains such as Benbulben.

W.B. Yeats and his brother the artist Jack B. Yeats are strongly associated with the county and much of their work is set there. W.B. Yeats grave at Drumcliffe is a popular attraction. The well known epitaph penned by the poet himself reads Cast a cold Eye On Life, on Death. Horseman, pass by.

The Yeats Trail is an intriguing journey that draws you into the world of Nobel poet WB Yeats and his artist brother Jack Yeats. The Trail brings you on a unique experience through landscape, literature, history and culture. Consider this a "must do" on your visit!

Historically the county is quite significant, especially **Carrowmore** which is the largest megalithic cemetery in Ireland and one of the most important in Europe dating back to nearly 5,000 BC. Lissadell House has a romantic history, associated with both Yeats and the republican Countess Markieviecz. The house and estate are now in private ownership.

Another Sligo gem is **Eagles Flying**, Ireland's largest sanctuary for birds of prey and owls which also houses the National Raptor Centre and has regular bird shows for visitors. In Gurteen, south Sligo, the **Coleman Music Centre** welcomes visitors and regularly hosts events and music classes. Sligo Folk Park in Riverstown promises a true experience of rural and Irish heritage that is based on a traditional cottage farm. A small replica cottage at the Folk Park called 'Mrs Buckley's Cottage' has actually travelled all over the world for Irish celebrations.





Sligo towns and villages

Ballymote H2 is located 15 miles to the south of Sligo Town close to Keash Hill and boasts some of the best coarse fishing in the county.

Cliffony F2 in North Sligo overlooks Donegal Bay and Mullaghmore Harbour. Surrounded by sea and mountains, the area includes a series of pleasant discoveries such as the Gleniff Horseshoe and Creevykeel Court Tomb.

Collooney G2 located on a small hill 7 miles south of Sligo town. The rising of 1798, a milestone in Irish history is commemorated by the Teeling monument in the village.

Drumcliffe G2 nestled under the foot of Benbulben and famous as the final resting place of W B Yeats whose grave is in the churchyard under a simple headstone with the inscription: "Cast a cold Eye On Life, on Death. Horseman, pass by."

Easkey G1 lies on the river 'Lough Easkey' west of Sligo Town which is well known for its salmon and trout fishing and for its great surf. A mile south of Easkey is the unusual Split Rock — it is said that if someone dares to go through the split three times, the rock will close in on them!

Enniscrone G1 a charming resort on the shores of Killala Bay. The deep bay hosts a wonderful sandy beach, a 5km stretch with safe bathing. Take time out to relax at Kilcullens seaweed baths with hot seawater, seaweed and steam. The Moy estuary which forms part of the bay is a popular haunt for game anglers.

Grange G2 is the starting point for a spectacular drive through the Glennif Horseshoe. Huge limestone cliffs in the valley between the towering Truskmore and Kings Mountain and a cave associated with the legendary lovers Diarmuid and Grainne, are some of the features of the drive.

Gurteen H2 (Gorteen) located in South Sligo. Based on this unique history of traditional Irish music, Gurteen is host to the Coleman Irish Music Centre. Not too far away is Moygara Castle a 16th Century Castle overlooking Lough Gara that was once the principal home of the O'Gara clan.

Mullaghmore F2 is a small fishing village located between Cliffoney and Grange. A superb sandy beach stretching as far as the eye can see (3km), which is safe for swimming, windsurfing and water sports. It is renowned for being a base for licensed angling/passenger boats for charter, sea angling and trips to Inishmurray Island with sheltered anchorage for small and medium craft at the harbour.

Riverstown H2 a lovely village with Sligo Folk Park in the centre of it — a great haven for tourists, once a year the Folk Park hosts The Annual Vintage Day which is becoming more successful each year!

Rosses Point G2 is a seafaring village situated 8km from Sligo. A seaside resort with unique features, including an 18-hole championship golf course, two magnificent sandy beaches, a yacht club and fully equipped sea angling boats for hire.

Sligo Town G2 the largest town in the North-West The town is built on several gravel ridges giving it an interesting and cosy appearance and centers around its five bridges.





Touring Routes

We have chosen some great driving routes which will introduce you to many of the region's most famous sights and attractions and also to lesser known gems.

Please note that the length and recommended time of drives are approximate, depending on number of sites visited along routes and time spent there. Routes can be travelled in any direction and from any starting point, map illustrations are intended as a guide only, and routes should be used in conjunction with reference to a good road map of Ireland.



DONEGAL BAY DRIVE

Route 1: Bundoran » Pettigo » Donegal » Killybegs » Malin Beg » Ardara » Donegal

Distance: 198km/123miles (approx)

Leaving **Bundoran** seaside resort, travel north on the N15 to **Ballyshannon**, then take the R231 to **Creevy Pier** and **Rossnowlagh** set in 4km crescent of golden sand. Pressing on, you rejoin the



N15 north and at **Laghey** take the R232 to **Pettigo** then the R233 to **Lough Derg**, which attracts over 30,000 annually to its pilgrimage site. Return to the
N15 to **Donegal Town**, a bustling town. Take the N56 to **Mountcharles, Inver, Dunkineely** and into **Killybegs**, a fishing town with Ireland's largest fleet
of trawlers. Then take the R263 **Kilcar & Carrick**, a picturesque area with its
mountains, valleys, beaches and bays. Enjoy scenic views of **Sliabh Liag**, which
are said to be the highest marine cliffs in Europe. The next villages of **Malin Beg and Malin More** have wild scenery, dramatic cliffs and sandy beaches leading on
to **Glencolumbkille** renowned for its wealth of traditional culture, music and
prehistoric settlements. Then take the R330 through the **Glengesh Pass**to **Ardara**

ARDARA TO THE BLUESTACKS

Route 2: Ardara » Rosbeg » Portnoo » Glenties » Ballybofey » Barnesmore Gap » Donegal

Distance: 93km/58miles (approx)

Departing **Ardara**, a Heritage town and a centre for the manufacture of hand woven tweed, on the R261 north, divert left to **Rosbeg** a lovely resort village and angling centre



with fine sandy beaches. Continue on through the twin towns of **Narin/Portnoo** rejoining the R261 north. The next stop is **Kilclooney** with its megalithic sites notably the **Kilclooney Dolmen**. The Dolmen Eco Tourism Centre, the first green energy centre is located here. Then the N56 south to **Glenties**, the prolific winner of the National Tidy Towns competition, set against a backdrop of beautiful mountain scenery is your next stop. The R250 will take you to **Fintown** and the only operational narrow gauge railway in **Donegal**. Then the R252 to the twin towns **Ballybofey/Stranorlar** linked by an arched bridge. Take the N15 south to **Barnesmore Gap** the impressive gateway between north and south **Donegal**, past **Lough Eske** surrounded by the **Bluestack Mountains** and on to **Donegal Town**.

THE ROSSES & GWEEDORE

Route 3: Dungloe » Kincasslagh » Crolly » Meenlaragh » Churchill » Dungloe

Distance: 176km/110miles (approx)

Dungloe capital of the Rosses and home to the Mary from Dungloe Festival is your starting point. The R259 will take you on a crescent drive visiting Burtonport, a fishing port where you can



embark for the island of **Arranmore**. You may visit **Cruit Island** a wildfowl sanctuary. **Kincasslagh** home to the famous singer Daniel O'Donnell and to **Annagry/Crolly** is situated in the heart of the Irish speaking Rosses and home to Clannad and Altan. The N56 north will bring you to **Gweedore**, then take the R257 north to **Bunbeg and Derrybeg**. Catch the ferry to **Tory Island** from **Meenlaragh** or continue onto **Gortahork** and on to **Falcarragh**. Head back on the R256 and onto **Glenveagh National Park** containing some of the finest castle gardens in Ireland. The R251 will take you onto **Churchill**. Return to **Dungloe** via the R254, then the R252 and the N56 north.

FANAD PENINSULA TO SHEEPHAVEN BAY

Route 4: Letterkenny » Falcarragh » Dunfanaghy » Milford » Fanad Head » Rathmullan » Letterkenny

Distance: 188km/115miles (approx)

Leave **Letterkenny**, the largest town in Donegal and gateway to Fanad peninsula on the R245 for **Ramelton** a heritage town.



Continue on to **Rathmullan** a popular seaside resort and famous for the historical Flight of Earls. Take the R268 to **Portsalon** home to Ballymastocker Bay and its beautiful beach. Take the R247 to **Fanad Head** and its scenic drive. Then you may take the Harry Blaney Bridge from Leat Beg to Carrigart, or retrace your steps taking the R246 and the R245 to **Milford** which lies at the foot of Mulroy Bay. Continue on the R245 to **Carrigart, Downings, Rosapenna** and **Rosguill** which offers some of the most spectacular views of the Atlantic Ocean. Rejoin the N56 north to **Creeslough** with Doe Castle and Ards Forest Park in the nearby vicinity. Continue on to **Marble Hill, Portnablagh** and **Dunfanaghy** and follow the Horn head drive for the dramatic views of the powerful Atlantic. Then drive onto **Falcarragh** and through the **Muckish Gap** to **Kilmacrennan**, returning to **Letterkenny** via the N56.

RAPHOE, GRIANAN AILEACH & INCH ISLAND

Route 5: Letterkenny » Raphoe » Lifford » Newtown Cunningham » Inch Island » Letterkenny

Distance: 122km/78miles (approx)

Starting in **Letterkenny**, take the N13/R239 to **Convoy**, divert south to the villages of **Killygordon** and **Castlefinn** and then take N15



north to **Lifford** which for centuries has been gateway to Donegal's archaeological hinterland. The R264 north will take you to **Raphoe** set in rich farming country with its triangular 'Diamond' is a typical 17th century Plantation town. Continue on the R264 joining the N14 and the N13 north to **Burt** and Grianan Aileach Stone fort which dates back to 1,700BC. It is closely associated with Niall of the Nine Hostages. Burt Castle is one of the best known castles situated near the main Derry to Letterkenny road. Passing through **Bridgend** which is the starting point of the Inishowen 100 scenic drive, take the R238 to **Burnfoot** and onto the nature reserve on **Inch Island**, an excellent place for bird watching.

INIS EOGHAIN 100


Route 6: Buncrana » Dunaff » Cardonagh » Malin Head » Culdaff » Greencastle » Muff » Fahan » Buncrana

Distance: 147km/91miles (approx)

Beginning in the town of **Buncrana** with its 5km of sandy beach and Fort Dunree Military Museum, take the R238 to **Clonmany** and then onto **Ballyliffin** a golfer's paradise



and home to Doagh Visitor Centre. **Carndonagh** is the main agricultural centre serving farmers for miles around. Travel via the R242 to Malin with its 10 arched stone bridge and then to **Malin Head**, the most northerly point in Ireland. Retracing your steps to **Malin** take the R243 to **Culdaff**, rich in historical sites and then to **Kinnagoe Bay**, then rejoin the main R241 road south at **Stroove**. The strand here leads to a cave through a natural arch. Continue on through **Greencastle**, a commercial fishing port and ferry crossing to Magilligan and home to Inis Eoghain Maritime Museum and Planetarium. The drive continues through the beautiful small towns and villages of **Moville, Redcastle, Muff** and **Fahan** and then back to **Buncrana**.

SHANNON ERNE TOUR

Route 7: Carrick-on-Shannon

- » Ballinamore » Carrigallen
- » Dromod » Jamestown » Carrick-On-Shannon

Distance: 92km/58miles (approx)

Beginning in **Carrick-on-Shannon**, take the R280 north follow the signs for **Leitrim Village** which is the gateway to the Shannon-Erne



waterway. Continue on the R209 for Keshcarrigan. **Ballinamore** is the next village of your tour and here is where you will find the Leitrim Genealogical Centre, Museum and Library. Leaving Ballinamore on the R204 connecting to the R201 to **Carrigallen. St Patrick's Holy Well** is worth a visit in this area. Continuing on the R201 to **Mohill** and **Lough Rynn** estate which contains 100 acres of rare woodland and exotic, walled ornamental gardens. Then the R202 to **Dromod** a lively town on the banks of the River Shannon, where Steam train excursions are available. Then join the N4 north and divert to **Drumsna Village**, situated on a hill overlooking the Shannon. Then on to **Jamestown** a pleasant mooring spot and return to Carrick-on-Shannon via the N4.

LOUGH ALLEN TOUR

Route 8: Drumshanbo »
Ballinaglera » Dowra »
Drumkeerin » Drumshanbo

Distance: 46km/28miles (approx)

Start this tour in **Drumshanbo**. The **Sliabh Na Iarainn Visitor Centre** provides an audio visual history of Leitrim, an area renowned for traditional music. Try the excellent facilities at the **Acres Lake Amenity Area**.



Take the R207 for **Ballinaglera** where you will find the **Lough Allen Adventure Centre**, which offers a wide range of activities. Next stop is **Dowra**, a walker's paradise as The Miners, The Leitrim and The Cavan Way all meander through the area. From Dowra take the R200 to **Drumkeerin Village** which boasts a fine Heritage Centre. Leaving **Drumkeerin** take the R280 to **Tarmon** where you will come across the Abbey, which was founded by the O'Rourke family. This ancient building stands in ruins amidst graves and tombstones on Lough Allen's shore. Lavagh forest is nearby. Continue on the R280 back to **Drumshanbo**.

LOUGH GILL

Route 9: Sligo » Slish Wood » Dromahair » Sligo

Distance: 35km/22miles (approx)

From **Sligo** town take the R287 for **Dromahair**, stopping at the **'Holywell'** where mass was celebrated during Penal times. Then you will soon reach **'Dooney Rock'** mentioned in Yeats poem the Fiddler of Dooney. This circuit trail



leads to a stunning vista at the summit. Next stop is **Slish Wood** where you will find a pleasant forest, lakeshore and hillside walks. Further on the circuit of Lough Gill meander down lanes to view the **Lake Isle of Innisfree**. Passing through **Dromahair** Village and take the R288 to **Parkes Castle**, a 17th century fortified manor house. From here you may take a cruise aboard the **Rose of Innisfree**. Head back towards **Sligo** on the R286 around the northern end of Lough Gill with views over Clogagh Lough. Enroute to **Sligo**, visit **Hazelwood** with its forest park and trail, which will be signposted.

NORTH SLIGO

Route 10: Rosses Point » Sligo » Drumcliffe » Mullaghmore » Creevykeel

Court Tombs » Gleniff Horseshoe » Glencar » Sligo

Distance: 93km/58miles (approx)

Leaving **Rosses Point**, a picturesque village with beaches, golf course and sailing club, on the R291, back towards **Sligo** head



north on the N15 to the village of **Rathcormac** where a magnificent bronze memorial of Countess Markievicz stands. Next is **Drumcliffe**, the final resting place of W.B Yeats. On to **Cliffony** take the R279 to **Mullaghmore** with its wonderful headland and Classiebawn Castle on the horizon and Inishmurray Island in the distance. Return to the N15 north to visit **Creevykeel Court Tombs** and take the scenic drive around the **Gleniff Horseshoe** back towards **Sligo**.

At **Castletown** village take the signpost for **Glencar Waterfall** which inspired Yeats in his poem "Stolen Child". Follow the road around the lake emerging at the N16 and take a right turn back to **Sligo** above **Glencar Lake**.

Distance: 110km/69miles (approx)

Leave **Sligo** taking the R292 to **Strandhill** Seaside Village, where the great Atlantic provides spectacular surfing. Knocknarea Mountain dominates the peninsula, the legendary burial place of Queen Maeve.



Continue on the R292 until you reach **Ballysadare**. Take the N59 on to **Beltra** where you will see the **Ox Mountains** on your left. Before entering **Skreen** turn towards **Knockalongy**, to take the scenic drive along over the mountains known as **Ladies Brae** and it offers panoramic views of the Sligo Coastline. Back on the N59 you may take a right out to **Aughris Head** which offers a wild and rugged cliff walk. Continuing on, take the R297 to **Easkey**, famous for its salmon and trout and then on to **Enniscrone** a little seaside holiday town famous for its sunsets. The stunning beach known as the Hollow stretches for 5km. Return to **Sligo** via the R297 and the N59.

SOUTH SLIGO


Route 12: Sligo » Castlebaldwin » Keash » Gorteen » Ballymote » Sligo

Distance: 81km/50miles (approx)

From **Sligo** take the N4 south, divert to **Riverstown** and visit **Sligo Folk Park**. Return to the N4 to **Castlebaldwin**. By taking the small back roads we come to **Keash** where you can view the

'The Caves of Keash'. From Keash take the R295 to Gorteen, otherwise known as 'Coleman Country' where you can visit the Coleman Music Centre dedicated to ensuring that the tradition of Irish music remains a living one. Take the R293 which will bring you to a traditional market town known as Ballymote and nearby you can visit Eagles Flying, the Irish Raptor Research Centre where you can see many birds of prey and watch wonderful flying demonstrations. Return to Sligo on the N17.

A valid driving licence is required by the visitor from their country of residence. Driving in Ireland is on the left hand side of the road. Safety belts must be worn at all times by front and back seat passengers.

Motorcyclists and their passengers must wear safety helmets whilst driving.

BANKS

Banks are generally open from Monday to Friday from 10am – 4pm. Each bank has one later opening day per week. Bureau de Change facilities as well as ATM machines are available at most banks. Money transfers can be organised through Western Union Money Transfer.

CLIMATE

Influenced by the Gulf Stream, Ireland has a mild temperature climate with summer temperatures generally ranging from 14 to 16 degrees Celsius (60- 70 Fahrenheit). The temperatures are generally around 10 degrees Celsius (50 degree Fahrenheit) in Spring and Autumn and between 4 and 7 degrees Celsius (30-40 degrees Fahrenheit) in Winter. CREDIT CARDS

MasterCard, Visa and American Express credit cards are widely accepted in Ireland.

CURRENCY

The unit of currency in the Republic of Ireland is the Euro. One euro consists of 100 cents. Notes are €5, €10, €20, €50, €100, €200, €500. Coins are 1c, 2c, 5c, 10c, 20c, 50c, €1 and €2.

ELECTRICITY

The standard voltage in the Republic of Ireland is 220 volts. Plugs are 3-pin flat, therefore adapters are required for 2-pin appliances. En-suite bathroom shaving points normally have 110 and 240 volt outlets.

EMERGENCY SERVICES

In Ireland the general Emergency Telephone number is 999 or 112 – no coins required in telephone coin boxes. These numbers will alert the appropriate service – Fire, Gardaí (Police), Lifeboat, Coastal, Mountain and Cave Rescue Services.

MEDICAL & HEALTH TREATMENT
